He was a member of the Ewell United Methodist Church where he sang in the choir & was a member of the Ewell Men's Quartet. He was an honorary lifetime member of the Ewell Volunteer Fire Dept. & served on the board of the museum on the island.

Jennings loved sports but baseball was his favorite. He was an avid Oriole fan & also loved to announce the island baseball games.

Jennings was married to the love of his life, Edwina, for 72 years & had 2 wonderful children.
