**AWARDED DEGREE IN EDUCATION**

SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION  
 MAJOR FIELD OF STUDY

A native of Ewell, Smith Island who has climbed to a high level in the field of education, was signally honored on Wednesday of last week, June 1st, when the degree of Doctor of Education was conferred upon him at the 139th Annual Commencement exercises of The George Washington University in Washington, D. C. The awarding of the degree was the culmination of seven years of study in the school of education. His major field of study was school administration.

Mr. William Benjamin Evans, Jr., son of the late William B. and Clara Bradshaw Evans, was born at Ewell on March 7, 1914. He attended the Ewell Elementary School, and graduated from Crisfield High School. He received a three-year diploma from Maryland State Teachers College in Towson, Md., in 1935, and was a teacher at the Severna Park Elementary School in Severna Park, Md., from 1935 to 1937. He taught at the Richard Henry Leo Elementary School in Glen Burnie, Md., in 1937-38.

Mr. Evans was advanced to Teaching Principal at the Solley Elementary School in Solley, Md., in 1938, holding this position until 1941. In the meantime he received his B.S. degree in Education from the University of Maryland in 1940. From 1940 to 1944 Mr. Evans returned to his
