

AWARDED DEGREE IN EDUCATION

SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION MAJOR FIELD OF STUDY

A native of Ewell, Smith Island who has climbed to a high leve in the field of education, was signally honored on Wednesday of lest week, June 1st, when the degree of Doctor of Education was conferred upon him at the 139th Armital Commencement exercises of The George Washington University in Washington, D. C. The awarding of the degree was the culmination of seven years of study in the school of education. His major field of study was school administration,

He attended the Dwell Elementary School, and graduated from Crisfield High School.
