Caroline Messick's mother Lavinia Evans Bradshaw was the daughter of King Richard Evans, who was the brother of Francis, & Solomon Evans. King Richard is buried in the Rhodes Point Cemetery along side of his 1st wife Kesiah Evans. King Richard's Daughter Lavinia, is also buried at Rhodes Point near her husband Jacob T. Bradshaw. Caroline & husband David Messick are buried in the Ewell Church Cemetery, close by the graves of Carlos & Hester Ann Jones.

King Richard's 2nd wife Euphremy, and his Brother Uncle Sol Evans are also buried in the Ewell Methodist Cemetery.

David Messick came from a village that was located between Deal's Island and Princess Anne. It was called "Pidgeon House." David & his brother Johnson A. Messick came to Smith Island with their mother Mrs Johnson Messick Sr. and lived in a home at Fogs Point. Later, Johnson Messick Jr. married Charlotte Tyler of Smith's Is. and his brother David Messick married Caroline Bradshaw of Rogues Point, and built a home of their own near Scieners Cove.

The village known as "Pidgeon House" is no longer there. By 1875, it had all eroded away. Johnson & his wife Charlotte, were buried in the Rhodes Point Cemetery.

Carlos R. Jones was born across the bay in Northumberland County, Va. in 1845. His father and mother were Lindsey & Elizabeth Rogers Jones Carlos was a Virginia Confederate soldier, and had fought in two battles, when he was only 17 years old. After fighting in two battles, Carlos tried to return to his home in Northumberland, Co. but found the entire Northern Neck of Virginia was occupied by Union Troops. With no place to return to, young Carlos was lucky to find a small skiff on the shoreline by the bay. He took a chance to row across the bay, and made to the upper part of Smith's Is, near the farm of David & Caroline Messick. Carlos later became the Captain of the Bugeye Maggie Dora.
