Rev. Laban Evans Sr. was an exhorter "Local Preacher" at the early day Methodist Episcopal Church at Orchard Ridge (Kizy's Point) There was About six Exhorters at The Smith Island M.E. Church in those days, whose duties would be to take charge of the Sunday Church Services in the absence of the Charge preacher (which was quite often, because most of the Smith Island Charge Ministers had to come from the mainland (where most of them lived) to preach at the island church on Sunday, if the weather permitted.

Rev. Laban was one of four sons born to Jessie & Nancy Evans, who owned most of what is now Ewell, Md. In Jessie's Will dated 1835, he divided up all of his land and left it to his four sons. The eldest son was William, followed by Benjamin, Laban, and Noah Evans.

Rev. Laban, farmed his land (which took in all of the land where the present day Ewell Methodist Church, cemetery, Parsonage, and the Wilson and Butler Tabernacle now stand.) However, when Laban died in 1869, he divided up his land in his will, and left it to his seven sons. But it wasn't enough land for each of his seven sons to farm. Fortunately, by 1869, The Chesapeake Bay became heavily populated with oysters, and all of Rev. Laban's sons became among the first Smith Island Watermen to give-up farming, and took to the water, in Long Island style oyster schooners. The seven Evans sons had a fleet of of Eight oyster schooner 's at one time, and hired many men from both sides of the bay to crew them.
