 Both Solomon and Jesse Evans were born in approx. 1760
 and niether of them would be of legal age in 1778. Legal
 age at the time being 21 for males and 18 for females.

 The effect of the tent meeting on the upper end of the
 island range, was not less striking and salutary. Solomon
Evans had been to a camp meeting in Potatoe Neck the year pre-
 vious and there "tasted of the good word of life," under ser-
 mon by the Rev. Solomon Sharp. Richard, his brother, had always
 favored the Methodists, and had attended a number of the great
 mettings in Annamessex and Accomac; these two men took a

prominent and leading part in the revival on Smith's Island. At the house of "King" Richard, a prayer meeting was appointed. The people had assembled from every part of the Island. p.100 of the same.

Rev. Wm. Evans, long a resident of Smtih's Island, anda companion in travels and labors with Brother Thomas, now residing in Northumberland County Va. -- was at that time quite young, but remembers the day distinctly. In a conversation recently with the writer he said-- "I shall never forget the first and the second time I saw Brother Thomas, and the contrast between these two occasions. The first time I ever laid eyes on him, I saw ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ him, he was engaged dancing at a great ball or frolic held at my father's ("KingjRichard Evans') house. The second was in the marsh grass alone praying!
